Research projects will be expected to demonstrate alignment to HWQld's strategy, including reference to the primary and secondary parameters below.

Description of primary parameters:

- **Prevention**: An approach that focuses on protecting, maintaining, and promoting the health and wellbeing through prevention, rather than diagnosis and treatment, of disease
- **Public and population health**: Research that focuses on the health and wellbeing of communities and social groups, rather than on individuals.
- **Systems-based**: The HWQld approach is systems-based, requiring complexity-aware methods and a perspective involving a focus on the whole picture and not just a single element, awareness of the wider context, an appreciation for interactions among different components, and transdisciplinary thinking.
- **Equity**: A commitment to equity and for research to be a tool for advancing equity. It recognises that research will involve a diverse range of population subgroups and needs to be adaptable to local cultural and social contexts.
- **Theory-informed**: A theory-driven approach is required to demonstrate how research is understood to contribute to systems change and population outcomes, and to ensure that this aligns with the HWQld's strategy.
- **Impact-orientated:** Approaches that demonstrate strategies and pathways for achieving and capturing impact across all stages of research design, conduct, dissemination and translation.

Description of secondary parameters:

- **Social determinants of health**: An approach that recognises that the conditions in which people live and wider social and economic systems, norms and policies influence health.
- **Implementation science:** Real world research that contributes to understandings of how to promote and implement the uptake of evidence into policy and practice.
- **Participatory:** Approaches that recognise the importance of involving end users across the research life cycle, from design through to delivery and reporting.
- **Multidisciplinary:** An approach that brings together the varied perspectives of different academic disciplines and sectors (from across policy, practice and industry).
- **Settings/place based:** Approaches that are collaboratively designed and delivered in place, developed with and targeted to the needs of the place and people within it.
- **Intersectionality:** An approach that recognises the complexity of social groups' characteristics, which intersect and lead to cumulative disadvantage.
